Dear families,

Term 3 has begun smoothly, and the children have settled back in well to class and school routines. The learning program across all year levels is both interesting and purposeful and the students are actively engaged in their learning. I am particularly impressed with the quality of work, and the progress being made, through our "Science of Reading" focus. Our staff continue to develop their skills through quality professional learning opportunities, and the impact of this learning is clearly evident in their classrooms.

Last week, we welcomed 24 brand new receptions to the St Francis School community! They and their families have settled in well to

school life and they are a joy to have with us! Thankyou to Ms Diem Savy for her wonderful work with the children during transition, which has set them up for a successful start to school!

Covid -19 continues to have an impact on both student and staff attendance, and so it is vitally important that we all continue to follow the current health advice. Hopefully you will have all seen the letter I sent last week from the Director and the Chief Public health Officer, strongly recommending the wearing of masks for all children from year 3, and for all adults in indoor settings. Our staff are wearing their masks vigilantly to keep your children and themselves as safe as possible. We encourage you to consider sending your child to school with a Mask. Families are asked to wear masks whenever attending indoor venues at school-eg classrooms, OSHC, front office. Hopefully the current wave is passing and things will further settle.

There are a number of key events over the next few weeks at school. We have a variety of Sporting teams competing and representing the School and we wish all students every success in their endeavours. FROM THE DEPUTY

Dear Families,



Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the **Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability** (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- · category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 

Solemn Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, August 8th

Born in Melbourne (Australia) in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909, was beatified on 19th January 1995 and canonized a Saint on 17th October 2010. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence.

Sharing Best Practice Conference, Adelaide


Last Saturday 30th July, we had a number of staff attend the Sharing Best Practice conference held at Brighton Secondary School. One of the aims of the conference was to strengthen the bridge between research evidence and pedagogical practice in schools. The conference included researchers, teachers and practitioners, sharing and discussing evidence-based strategies that impact and enhance teaching and support the learning of all students.

We were very lucky to have some amazing keynote speakers on the day including Professor Pamela Snow, Associate Professor Tanya Serry, Jennifer Buckingham and Bill Hansberry. Pamela talked to us about the science of language and reading and described to us her Language House model (shown here). This was a very interesting talk about how language is at the heart of academic success.




Tanya Serry spoke about the personal and social costs for students who struggle with literacy and then went on to explain ways to teach based on cognitive sciences. These included Cognitive Load Theory, The Forgetting Curve and the Information Processing Model. This

image is from one of Tanya's slides and was about the best ways to help get information from the short-term memory into the long-term memory.



During the day, as well as listening to keynote speakers, we broke into breakout sessions to learn from different educators on many different topics. I was lucky enough to listen to Liana McCurry speak about delivering maths instruction through multisensory teaching and explicit instruction and to Chris Guy taking us through her school's journey teaching spelling and morphology. Others from our school participated in workshops around Sound Walls, reading, fluency and differentiation in schools.



At the end of the day, there was a lucky prize drawn and Leonie Fitzgerald (Reception teacher), was the lucky prize winner! Thanks to Seelect Educational Supplies, Leonie won a Decodable Readers Australia kit. What a way to end a wonderful day of learning.



I would like to thank all those teachers who willingly gave up their Saturday to continue their learning about the best practice for teaching

our students. We are blessed here at St Francis with quality educators who are willing to continue to improve, to learn and to follow the evidence in their practice.
