### FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear families,

Welcome to 2024! It has been a positive start to the 2024 school year, with students and staff settling in well. The first few weeks of the school year have included our 2024 'Building Connections' program. This year, we have incorporated aspects of a new wellbeing program being used in the school called 'Grow your Mind.' Grow Your Mind aims to enhance the social and emotional learning and wellbeing of children, school staff and families through supporting them to understand mental health and form habits of resilience. The program supports learning communities to develop a strong awareness of ways to protect and nurture wellbeing. The program is built

upon four pillars to promote mental health and wellbeing: positive psychology, social and emotional learning, public health and neuroscience. The program draws on the Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning's (CASEL) model of the 5 social and emotional learning competencies (self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, responsible decision-making, and relationship skills) to help children. This includes seeing children understand what a respectful relationship is and developing skills to foster a growth mindset. Grow Your Mind takes a whole-school approach. You may have already heard about GYM and some of the different brain characters such as 'Guard Dog' and 'Wise Owl!' This week, our teachers and students have commenced formal learning in earnest, including our Playberry Laser Phonology program which is consistently implemented across all classes. We are looking forward to monitoring progress and growth in all areas of the curriculum over the coming weeks.

Last week, we hosted a very successful 'Cybersafe families' evening, which followed student presentations during the day. Now more so than ever, it is vitally important to keep our children safe when engaging in an online world. Chris Greene and the team at Cybersafe families do an amazing job of providing support to families and schools in keeping our children safe! This week, we celebrated meet the teacher evening in a new way, with open classes and a community picnic. We felt this would be a more efficient way of imparting information to class parents and a great way of bringing the community together to begin the school year. I was very pleased with the turnout for the evening and we hope to continue this tradition into the future. My thanks to all families who found time to come along and actively engage in their children's learning!

This week was also the beginning of Lent, with the traditional Shrove Tuesday pancake cook up, and then the more sombre Ash Wednesday services. Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Jesus Resurrection at Easter. Fr Michael talked to the children during his homilies on Ash Wednesday, about Lent being a time of focussing on the Love God has for them all, and for us to focus during lent on how we could change our hearts and be more loving of one another and of the world around us, during Lent. As a school community, we look ahead now, to commemorating Lent through our RE program, and to focus on acts of Social Justice such as project Compassion.

Our building project is almost complete! I am nervously optimistic that our scheduled moving day on march the 15<sup>th</sup> can go ahead, and that students and families can be welcomed into the new space on Monday March 18. I will, of course keep you up to date with progress, and any potential barriers to project completion. Once the new building is occupied, the next stage of project completion will be to remove the transportable village, and to 'make good' the area. This will, understandable take some time to complete, and much of the major works will be undertaken in school holiday time in April. I am hopeful that the site will be completely restored by mid-May, and will keep families informed of progress.

### FROM THE DEPUTY

Dear Families,

Welcome to the 2024 school year. It has been wonderful to see our Reception students make such an independent start to the year. We pray that the year is rewarding and filled with many friendships, new experiences and enjoyment for all students.

I thank all families for the very positive response to the uniform note sent out in week 1. A reminder that new unform items can be ordered online at any time through the QKR app or purchased in person from our 'uniform shop' each Thursday before 9.30am or after 2.30pm.

#### Would you know what to do?

As part of WHS, the school practises either a lock in or an emergency evacuation each term. At some time in the future, we may practise these while parents are still present on school grounds. Would you know what to do?

Emergency Evacuation -Continuous sounding of the bell. We all meet on the oval and a roll call is taken.

<u>Emergency Lock in</u> – **Continuous wailing** bell will sound. Go to the nearest room, regardless of whether this is your child's classroom or not. Once everyone is safely inside, the teacher will then follow our site's lock-in procedures.

Your safety is important to us. If you have any questions regarding either of these procedures, please feel free to speak to me or any of the teachers.

### **Parking**

The safety of students is of paramount importance to us and while parking is difficult at any school, if we all follow the school procedures, we decrease the chances of accidents occurring. I ask that you to share the following information with all families and friends who may come to drop off or collect your child/ren.

- · Kiss and Drop Zone located in Arcoona Ave and at the front of the Church on Henley Beach Road
- The car park is only for staff parking and for students with a disability
- Please observe the parking signs on Arcoona Ave Parking Officers frequently patrol this area and will issue fines
- · Signs around our school
- Periodically, traffic inspectors from the city of West Torrens check that local drivers are following traffic rules around our school. Breaking these rules may result in a fine.

Here are some reminders for you.



### No Stopping

• To 'stop' a vehicle means to stop and remain stationary for even a short period of time. You must not stop or park your vehicle in any area where a 'No Stopping' sign or a continuous yellow edge line applies, even to pick up or set down passengers or goods.



### No Parking

- You must not park your vehicle in an area where a 'No Parking' sign applies, unless: you are dropping off or picking up passengers or goods you do not leave the vehicle unattended that is, move more than three metres away and you complete the dropping off or picking up as soon as possible in any case, within two minutes.
- Please note: A 'No Standing' sign has the same meaning as a 'No Stopping' sign.
- · Always use the crossing

# Shrove Tuesday/Pancake Tuesday 13th February

Shrove Tuesday refers to the shriving Bell to bring everyone to church to be shriven, or to confess his or her sins before the season of Lent. Early Christians observed strict rules of fasting and self-denial during Lent, so in the days before, they would eat unrestricted foods, party and have fun.

Dating back to 1000 AD, over the years Shrove Tuesday not only became a day for Confession but a time for Catholics to feast on eggs, sugar and dairy which are traditionally restricted during the Lenten fast.

The children enjoyed eating delicious pancakes for Shrove Tuesday. We celebrated Ash Wednesday with a Mass in the church for years 4-6 and a Liturgy of the Word for Reception – 3.

Ash Wednesday marks the **beginning** of 40 days of Lent. Ash Wednesday is observed by having the mark of the cross made on our forehead with ashes. The ashes are made from the blessed and burnt Palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. The sign of the cross **symbolises** repentance before God and is also a reminder that God is gracious and forgiving to all who seek to open their hearts to change.

The themes of Lent are fasting, giving to the poor, good works and prayer. This year the Project Compassion theme is "For Future Generations".

During Lent the Church recalls Jesus' life and ministry. Traditionally, Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and good works. (taken from CROSSWAYS – Religious Education framework)
