FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear families,

We have already reached the end of week 3! There have been so many events and activities happening this term, along with daily learning routines. Our learners have been working hard to achieve their new learning goals, refined by their semester one reports, and we are seeing great progress every day, through our regular progress monitoring-especially in Maths and English.

NAPLAN results were distributed recently to families of children in year 3 and 5. I was pleased with how well we performed overall in this year's NAPLAN tests, which were conducted earlier in the year than previously, and reported on using a completely new set of performance standards. Our overall school performance was rated as Strong and encouragingly, where it was identified that students required additional support, we already have measures in place to support these learners. My sincere thanks to Nives Kresevic, and the year 3 and 5 teachers for their oversight of the assessment cycle.

Last night our Wakakirri dance troupe performed at this year's event, in the Norwood town hall. I was a privilege to be present for their performance and I was blown away by how polished and professional their performance was. It is a credit to the students themselves and the outstanding coaching and leadership of Emma Gill and Olivia Bozzon. Our troupe were awarded a notable mention in a number of areas, especially in choreography, which was superb!

On Thursday, our SACPSSA Cross Country team competed at the 2023 carnival. It was a hugely successful event for St Francis, with our year 4 group winning the divisional age title, Chanel Maio winning Gold in the year 4 age group, Cooper Nicholson gold in the year 5 age group and Stephen Rapuano won Silver in the year 4 age group. There were many other notable performances as well. Sincere thanks to James Daley and James Goldy for their efforts in preparing the team, and in organising the carnival participation.

This week, we welcome for the first time, children who will be starting school in term 1 2024, in our "Little Francis" transition program. This is an exciting time for them and for us, and I thanks Leonie Fitzgerald and the reception team for their coordination and support of the program, which will run all the way through to week 7 of term 4.

This Saturday evening, we host our quiz night. With over 10 tables now sold, it promises to be a night of fun and frivolity-but most importantly, community connection. Sincere thanks to Terri Sparrow and the P & F for bringing the night to life. I look forward to seeing many of you there!

As you will by now have seen, our building is really beginning to take shape, and we can now get a sense of what it will be like. I understand that constraints the project has placed on the full functionality of our school, but give thanks every day that we still have great facilities and-importantly-expansive grounds for the children to be able to play and learn. Having been involved in projects in the past where play areas have been significantly disrupted, believe me, it is a blessing to have what we do! Once the project is completed and our full grounds and play areas are restored, our school will provide the kind of outdoor spaces other schools only dream of-bring on 2024!

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the **Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability** (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to

students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- · year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- · consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 

Feast Day of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop



Each year on the 8th of August we celebrate the Solemnity of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Australia's beloved first saint. On this day, we celebrate the important role she played in making education accessible for children in our country. Mary MacKillop devoted her life to ensuring a holistic Catholic education for children from rural, poor families.

St Mary MacKillop's impact on Australian education was remarkable. She was a trailblazer and a leader who passionately advocated for the education of underprivileged children and children in remote areas where others either would or could not go. For such children and their families, Mary opened a door of hope into the future.

Classes have engaged in learning about Mary throughout the week to remember how we can be like Mary in word and deed. The Year 4's celebrated Mass on Wednesday of this week on the theme of Mary MacKillop and how we can be like Mary. It was a lovely celebration with students and families.

Feast of the Assumption



Tuesday, 15 August the Church celebrates the Feast Day of the Assumption of Our Lady, when according to our faith, the Holy Mother, "having completed her course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory".

The Assumption signals the end of Mary's earthly life and marks her return to heaven to be reunited with Jesus. While the bodies of both Jesus and Mary are now in heaven, there is a difference between the Assumption and the Resurrection. Where Jesus arose from the tomb and ascended into heaven by his own power, Mary's body was taken up to heaven by the power of her Son.

At St Francis, we will celebrate the Feast of the Assumption by participating in in-class liturgies throughout the day with student representatives from Years 3-6 joining in the Parish Mass in the morning. Families are welcome to attend the Parish Mass at 9:15 in the Church.

LITERACY

A focus on Fluency

Comprehension of texts is the end goal. Comprehension of texts involves extracting and constructing meaning from written text using knowledge of words, concepts, facts and ideas. Comprehension is highly related to background knowledge and vocabulary and students need good fluency before comprehension can occur. When children read fluently decoding becomes easier and automatic and frees up their attention to focus on the meaning of the text.

A fluent reader reads texts with a high degree of accuracy, at a rate similar to their speaking voice with expression.

So how can we increase fluency?

"The keys to the development of reading fluency include modelling fluent reading for students and providing students with repeated reading practice of written passages, while at the same time providing assistance and coaching in the repeated reading."

Rasinski, Homan and Biggs (2009)

At St Francis, repeated reading of texts occurs within the classrooms and at home using carefully selected texts through; decodable texts, connected texts, knowledge based texts and literary texts. Reading is modelled and practised through a variety of strategies such as echo reading, paired reading, choral reading, readers theatre and using technology such as Microsoft Teams to monitor accuracy and rate.

At home there are a couple of ways you can support your child's fluency;

encourage them to repeatedly read the decodable/connected text assigned to them and devlop their background knowledge and vocabulary by reading to your child, or supporting your child to read, a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts.
