

Halloween

THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (All Souls)

All Soul's Day is a Roman Catholic day of remembrance for friends and loved ones who have passed away.

This day of commemoration began early in the Middle Ages with annual prayers for the dead in monastic communities. Fixed on this day, it spread more widely after the tenth century and now ranks with the principal feast days in the liturgical calendar. Commonly known as All Souls, it expresses Christian faith in the communion of saints and our need to pray for one another in the Church.

Prayer for Remembrance Day, November 11th



Originally called Armistice Day, this day commemorated the end of the hostilities for the Great War (World War I), the signing of the armistice, which occurred on 11 November 1918 - the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

After the end of World War II in 1945, the Australian and British governments changed the name to Remembrance Day as an appropriate title for a day which would commemorate all the men and women who fought and died in wars.

LITERACY @ ST FRANCIS

Tier 2 Intervention from our co-educators

You might recall reading about the 3 Tiers of Intervention. Tier 1 being quality whole class teaching and Tier 3 being individual intervention. At St Francis, our Tier 3 Intervention is Playberry. Did you hear the news that we are now a Playberry Accredited School?!



At St Francis school, our Tier 2 intervention has changed dramatically this year. Teachers are using data to analyse each student's skills in many areas within the reading and spelling curriculum. They are then using this rich data to inform which students require extra help and support in particular areas; Tier 2 Intervention.

Tier 2 Intervention is delivered in a number of ways throughout the year levels. Teachers may work with small groups to re-teach particular skills and concepts, or our highly skilled co-educators may take pairs or small groups to do the same. Our co-educators are timetabled to each class throughout the day and the week. Examples of work done in these Tier 2 targeted small groups include work on alphabet recognition, handwriting practice, phonological awareness, re-teaching of spelling skills or concepts and fluency reading practice.

Through on-going professional learning, all teaching staff and co-educators are becoming more confident and competent using approaches based in the science of reading. Our Tier 2 approach shows this learning and how successful teaching this way is! I am in awe of the conversations I hear from teachers and co-educators when they are discussing a particular student and saying things like: "the student is now confident segmenting phonemes and so we have moved on to deleting and substituting". Both teacher and co-educators are seeing progress and sharing in the successes with each student.

As teachers at St Francis School, we are truly blessed to have highly skilled co-educators working with us in our rooms each day. Here they are: our classroom based education support officers.
