Personal Plans for Learning (PPL) timeline

When working with students, the staff of St Francis are committed to providing supports, adjustments and interventions which lead to better learning, wellbeing and inclusion.

Adjustments and supports provided to students are at the school, class and individual level and can include teaching and learning, behaviour support, wellbeing support, co-curricular programs, and facilities and services, including collaboration with allied health services.

Teachers of students who require Tier 2 or 3 intervention in addition to high-quality classroom instruction have a Personalised Plan for Learning (PPL) developed from an assessment of needs and professional assessments and which informs their teaching, learning and wellbeing.

Staff have started the year using last year's Semester 2 PPL for reference. During the coming weeks, teachers will be updating them to reflect the current classroom situation. In week 7, the Semester 1 2025 PPL will be sent home for your feedback/input and will be further discussed with you during parent meetings this term.

Would you know what to do?

As part of WHS, the school practises either a lock in or an emergency evacuation each term. At some time in the future, we may practise these while parents are still present on school grounds. Would you know what to do?

Emergency Evacuation - Continuous 'WOOP WOOP' sounding of the bell. We all meet on the oval and a roll call is taken.

<u>Emergency Lock in</u> – Continuous 'BEEP BEEP' bell will sound. Go to the nearest room, regardless of whether this is your child's classroom or not. Once everyone is safely inside, the teacher will then follow our site's lock-in procedures.

Your safety is important to us. If you have any questions regarding either of these procedures, please feel free to speak to me or any of the teachers.

Shrove Tuesday/Pancake Tuesday 4th March

Shrove Tuesday refers to the shriving Bell to bring everyone to church to be shriven, or to confess his or her sins before the season of Lent. Early Christians observed strict rules of fasting and self-denial during Lent, so in the days before, they would eat unrestricted foods, party and have fun.

Dating back to 1000 AD, over the years Shrove Tuesday not only became a day for Confession but a time for Catholics to feast on eggs, sugar and dairy which are traditionally restricted during the Lenten fast.

The children had a delightful time enjoying delicious pancakes for Shrove Tuesday. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to our dedicated parent volunteers: Sarah Mc, Charmaine, Erin, Rebecca, Emma, Mary, Annette, and Tad from the Lockleys parish, who generously gave their time to prepare pancakes for us. Ash Wednesday



As a school we celebrated Ash Wednesday with a Liturgy of the Word in the church.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of 40 days of Lent. Ash Wednesday is observed by having the mark of the cross made on our forehead with ashes. The ashes are made from the blessed and burnt Palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. The sign of the cross symbolises repentance before God and is also a reminder that God is gracious and forgiving to all who seek to open their hearts to change.

The themes of Lent are fasting, giving to the poor, good works and prayer. This year the Project Compassion theme is "Unite Against Poverty this Lent.". During Lent the Church recalls Jesus' life and ministry. Traditionally, Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and good works. (taken from CROSSWAYS – Religious Education framework)

Feast of St Patrick March 17th



March 17th is the feast day of St Patrick. St Patrick was born in Roman Britain around the end of the fourth century and he died in Ireland about the middle of the fifth century. St Patrick faced hardship as a missionary bishop in Ireland, and opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. He worked to conciliate, to evangelise, and to educate local leaders and their families. He is **remembered** for his simplicity and pastoral care, for his humble trust in God, and for his fearless preaching of the gospel to those who had enslaved him in his youth.

Specially honoured in Australia because of the many Irish people who came to settle here and brought with them the faith and zeal of St Patrick. The Catholic Church in Australia was largely founded by the Irish missionaries and Irish migrants.

Feast of St Joseph

On March 19th, we celebrate the feast of St Joseph, husband of Mary. A carpenter, though born of the royal house of David, Joseph was an upright man who, as husband of the Virgin Mary, cared for Mary and the child Jesus. **Venerated** in the East after the fourth century, and his followers flowered in the West during the fifteenth century, following the development of nativity plays, the Christmas crib, and increased devotion to Mary.
