FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear parents & caregivers,

We are fast approaching the end of another year at school, and here at St Francis, preparations are well advanced for the 2022 school year. In recent weeks, a number of key appointments have been finalised. I am delighted to share with you the appointment of Mrs

Angela DeNadai to the position of APRIM, commencing January 2022. Angela is currently the APRIM at St John the Baptist school, Plympton-a position she has held for the last 12 years.

Angela is a very experienced and capable APRIM, who has a demonstrated capacity for leading the Religious Education program, building strong personal relationships and nurturing the faith formation of students and staff. She worked very collaboratively with the Parish at Plympton, and built strong school-parish partnerships.

I'd like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank and congratulate Mrs Helen Wilsdon-Smith for many years of wonderful service at St Francis and she leaves a lasting legacy, which Angela is well placed to continue! Both Richard and Helen have made wonderful contributions to the St Francis community, and we sincerely thank them for many years of service to us, and to Catholic Education in SA. They will be properly farewelled at our end of year mass on Wednesday 8th December.

Year 6 Technology

As we head towards the end of the school year, the staff and students are very busy trying to fit as much as they can into the remaining weeks of the term.

The Year 6 students have transformed the Arts room into the city of Adelaide. As part of their STEAM inquiry project, the students built a 3D scale model of a significant historical building within Adelaide City. They then developed a coded program to move Sphero robots through the city. As the sphero stops at each major building, the speak function delivers information about the building that the students have scripted as part of their assignment. They have done an amazing job!



Instrumental Lessons

Many students at St Francis currently learn a musical instrument or were involved in choir. Learning a musical instrument provides rich opportunities for enjoyment and performance both in the present and for many years to come.

While the following is a guide for families as to what to bring in for the appeal, please donate what you can.

Year 6: Christmas pudding, cake, bon-bons or long life custard or milk.

Year 5: mince pies, tinned fruit, tea bags or coffee.

Year 4: cracker biscuits, pasta sauce or tinned ham, Christmas wrapping paper.

Year 3: sweet biscuits or tinned tuna.

Year 2: sweets/lollies, cordial or a packet of Gravox.

Year 1: jelly crystals, baby food, packets of pasta or rice.

Reception: tinned vegetables - carrots, peas, beans, corn or beetroot.
