

FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear parents & caregivers,

Week 7 already-hasn't it been nice to have some Spring weather this week! Learning continues apace at St Francis and on my regular

visits to classrooms I continue to be impressed with the quality of the learning experiences your children are involved with. There have been a number of significant activities in recent weeks – and upcoming – that showcase the holistic nature of our learning experiences. A great example of this has been recent Book Week activities, where the students not only dressed up for our annual parade but also connected with the world of books through class activities and rotations, as well as a myriad of activities through the resource centre. My thanks to Andrea Edwards for her organisation of Book Week activities. In coming weeks, we have Social Justice week, our year 6 history exhibition, our Instrumental Music evening and Catholic Schools Music Festival and-early in term 4 Sports Day! Each of these activities contribute to the curriculum experience for the children and add richness to that experience.

Students from St Francis have taken part in two sports carnivals this week – SACPSSA Touch Football, and SAPSASA Athletics. These carnivals are fantastic opportunities to participate in healthy physical activity, as well as to showcase the many talents of our students in the sporting arena. My thanks to James Daley and James Goldy for their continued advocacy and expertise in the sphere of Physical Education. As we talk all things Sport, an early reminder that our Annual Sports Day is to be held on the first Friday of term 4. We are currently planning for the carnival, and very much hope that we can be able to welcome families to the event. While the current restrictions will impact on that, we are praying for an easing of restrictions to allow for families to attend. More information to come!

Families would be aware of my recent communication regarding the future of SAPSASA. I am very pleased to be able to inform you that the proposed review of SAPSASA has been placed on hold, and the Minister for Education has expressed his strong commitment to the future of SAPSASA for all children in SA. I sincerely thank those who took the opportunity to discuss this matter with our local members!

During term 3 there has been a plethora of surveys circulated to you, and I am grateful for the very active responses received so far! One of those surveys was regarding the development of our next Strategic Plan, and I have appreciated the wisdom and insights families have provided. Your voice has been important in the development of this plan and we enter the next stage of the development of the plan with plenty of food for thought! I hope to be able to publish the Strategic Plan at the Annual General Meeting in term one 2022. One aspect of this planning, as you would be aware, has been the development of a Master Plan for building improvements. We will be meeting with each of the short listed Architects on Monday 13th September to hear their further thoughts on the development of a Master Plan. I will continue to keep you informed of this very important project.

Commencing term 4, St Francis is introducing a long transition to school program for children beginning reception, called "Little Francis." I am excited about this initiative, which will see children visiting school regularly throughout the term, to get used to being with us, to make some new friends, get to know our staff, orient themselves with our school etc. The aim of the program is to ensure a very smooth transition to school for all children – we will be offering a very similar program for our term 3 2022 cohort, during term 2 next year. This transition program will become a regular feature of life at St Francis and I am very much looking forward to welcoming the children early next term!

FROM THE DEPUTY

Dear Families

"The universe unfolds in God, who fills it completely. Hence, there is a mystical meaning to be found in a leaf, in a mountain trail, in a dewdrop, in a poor person's face. During Week 4, I had the opportunity to attend a retreat. Our focus was on 'exploring the experiences of God in Creation' and was based on creation, ecological conversion and insights from Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si. Our reflections touched on four Christian models of human relations with nature: the Nuptial model of Hildegard of Bingen, the fraternal model St Francis, the Benedictine custodial model and the Celtic animate model.

A few points to ponder.

· Each living thing reveals some aspect of God. God is greater than the whole of our universe


- When God manifests spirit through matter, then matter becomes a holy thing
- The material world is the place where we can comfortably worship God just by walking on it, loving it, and respecting it
- Everything visible, without exception, is the outpouring of God
- When we love something, we grant it soul, we see its soul, and we let its soul touch ours
- Until we can appreciate and even delight in the soul of other things, even trees and animals, we probably haven't discovered our own souls either

HUMAN SEXUALITY CURRICULUM

"So God created human kind in God's image, in the image of God, God created them; male and female..." Genesis 1: 26, 27

The Made in The Image of God (MITIOG), Human Sexuality Curriculum is mandated for South Australian Catholic Schools, for Years R-12. In Term 3 students engage with age-appropriate curriculum content regarding sexuality through the (MITIOG) curriculum.

MITIOG is based on the belief that humans created in God's image are deserved of the utmost dignity and respect. Sexuality, integral to the human person, is a sacred gift from God.

The teaching of the MITIOG program supports the fundamental belief that sexuality is good. Sexuality is a power that enables us to form

deep, interpersonal relationships and commitments.

The MITIOG program supports parents in their roles as the first and foremost educators in human sexuality.

In support of this partnership, MITIOG activities are sent home on a regular basis.

Sacrament of First Reconciliation

In the act of forgiveness, we are declaring our faith in the future of a relationship....

"Forgiveness gives us the capacity to make a new start... And forgiveness is the grace by which you enable the other person to get up, and get up with dignity, to begin anew...

On Saturday, September 11 & 18, Year 3 candidates will receive God's compassion and forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The format we use for the rite of Reconciliation is that it takes place in public on the sanctuary at the front of the church.

Parents introduce their child to Father Michael, but the sacrament is conferred quietly between the candidate and the priest.

The candidates feel a great sense of liberation when they experience Reconciliation for the first time.

We are all called to forgive but many of us find forgiveness hard. Some people only want to forgive when the person hurting them apologises. We don't have to wait for apologies to forgive because sometime the apology never comes. Our need to forgive is more important than another person's need to say sorry.
